

## Algernon “Algie” Ward Jr. – Trenton NJ



*“Algie”* is a retired Research Scientist from the New Jersey Department of Health and Environmental Laboratories. He is a widely respected Community Activist who currently serves as President and Founding Member of the 6<sup>th</sup> Regiment United States Colored Troops, Civil War and 1<sup>st</sup> Rhode Island Regiment Revolutionary War Reenactors. He is also a member of the Glover’s Marbleheaders Company B and the Ebony Doughboys World War I reenacting units. You can see him on film portraying Robert Smalls in *“Slavery and the Making of America”*, episode 4, *“The Challenge To Freedom”*, on the History Channel *“Washington Crossing The Delaware”*, and in *“Unsung Heroes of Valley Forge”* and *“John Hart Patriot”* documentaries. His image appears in the *“Oh Freedom”* traveling exhibit and two murals in Trenton, *“The Winds of Change”* and *“After The Crossing”* by Illia Barger. For Black History Month the 6th Regiment United States Colored Troops presents an annual program entitled *“Four Centuries of African American Soldiers”* and the 1st Rhode Island Regiment hosts *“Washington’s Landing In New Jersey”* at Washington Crossing State Park. The regiment also makes cameo appearances in the movies, *“The Wereth Eleven”* and *“The 24th”*. The 6th Regiment United States Colored Troops has been elected to sponsor the restoration of Locust Hill Cemetery and open Trenton’s first Black Museum there. Algernon serves as the Locust Hill Project Director and states that, *“Our mission is to tell the story of African American warriors to instill a deeper sense of pride and honor among those who desperately need to hear it. Knowing of the contributions of these black heroes and heroines inspires a deeper appreciation of Black peoples’ place in American history”*.
